Sample Eligibility For Mu Omicron, Alpha Phi Alpha, Inc. Memorial Scholarship

The Alpha Phi Alpha Scholarship committee established this scholarship to assist talented students who are at risk of failing to obtain a college education because of their cultural, economic or physical circumstances. Preference for this scholarship will be given to the economically disadvantaged minority candidate presenting a financial need for assistance, as well as one who displays a high potential for academic success. The scholarship is issued annually in the amount of \$500 for the Fall and Spring semesters and covers book fees and or materials needed outside of tuition.

1. A full time minority student with an overall and major grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0, on a four-point scale. Student must be a rising sophomore, junior or senior, to qualify for this scholarship.
2. Student must display a need for financial assistance. Financial eligibility will be determined by the VSU Financial Aid Office (as defined by the applicants Pell Grant eligibility status).
3. The written personal statement required by the Alpha Phi Alpha Scholarship Committee is an important piece of the application process. Applicants must submit a personal statement using 1000 words or less, which addresses the following topic: "How obtaining a scholarship of this nature would make a difference in the applicant's ability to continue his or her education".
4. All completed applications must be received by March 31st of each year.
5. The application packet must include a letter of recommendation from either an active member or the chapter advisor of the Valdosta State University, Mu Omicron Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity.
